Other business decisions include approving hire recommendations, bylaw revisions and the amended extended school day grant application. The new six hour day option starts in the 2017-2018 school year.

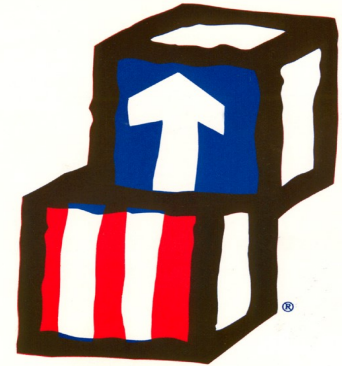
Holidays

Head Start of Lane County volunteers help to build our organizational strength and enrich the sense of community ownership. Children benefit from volunteers being in the classroom by sharing personal stories, reading books, tending the gardens and sharing smiles and laughter.

Matching a volunteer's skills, interest and professional growth is important when matching volunteers to openings and needs. Volunteers receive two orientations: one administrative and one site level. Volunteers are asked to keep a regular schedule, with a 1-3 hour shift to optimize the benefits for children. Last year, over 60,000 hours were recorded by volunteers.

Volunteers are required to enroll in the central background registry before being placed in a classroom. There is a direct link to the central background registry on the Head Start web site under "support us/volunteers". Being a Head Start volunteer also looks great on resumes!
